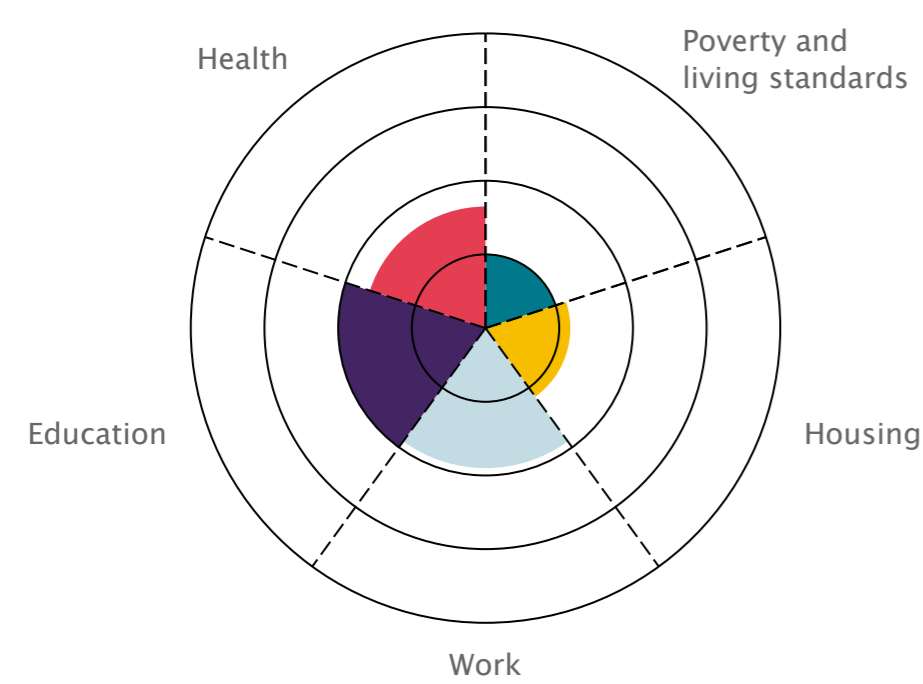

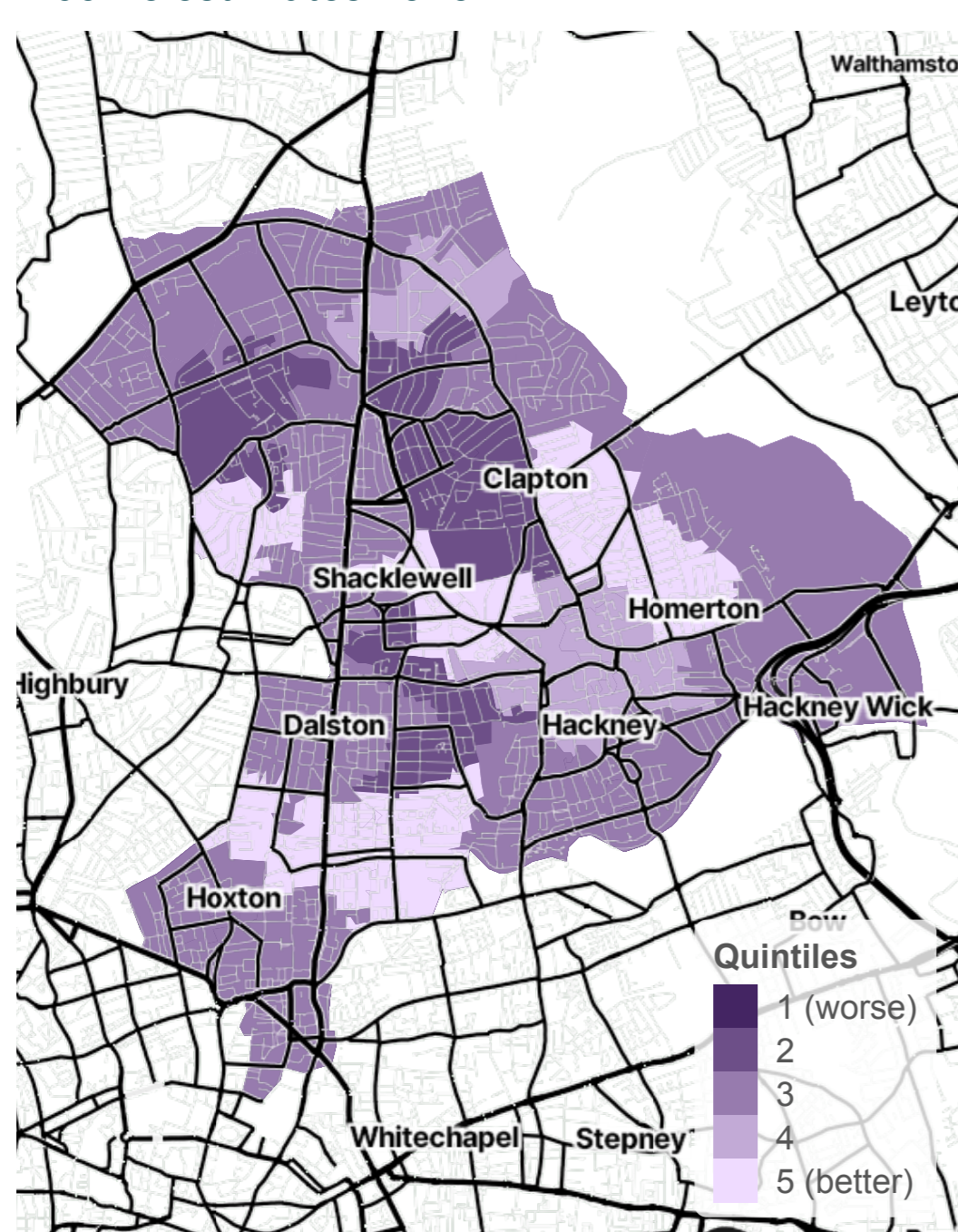


The chart above summarises the boroughs' indicators across each of our themes. The center represents worse performance, outer rings better

Key Points

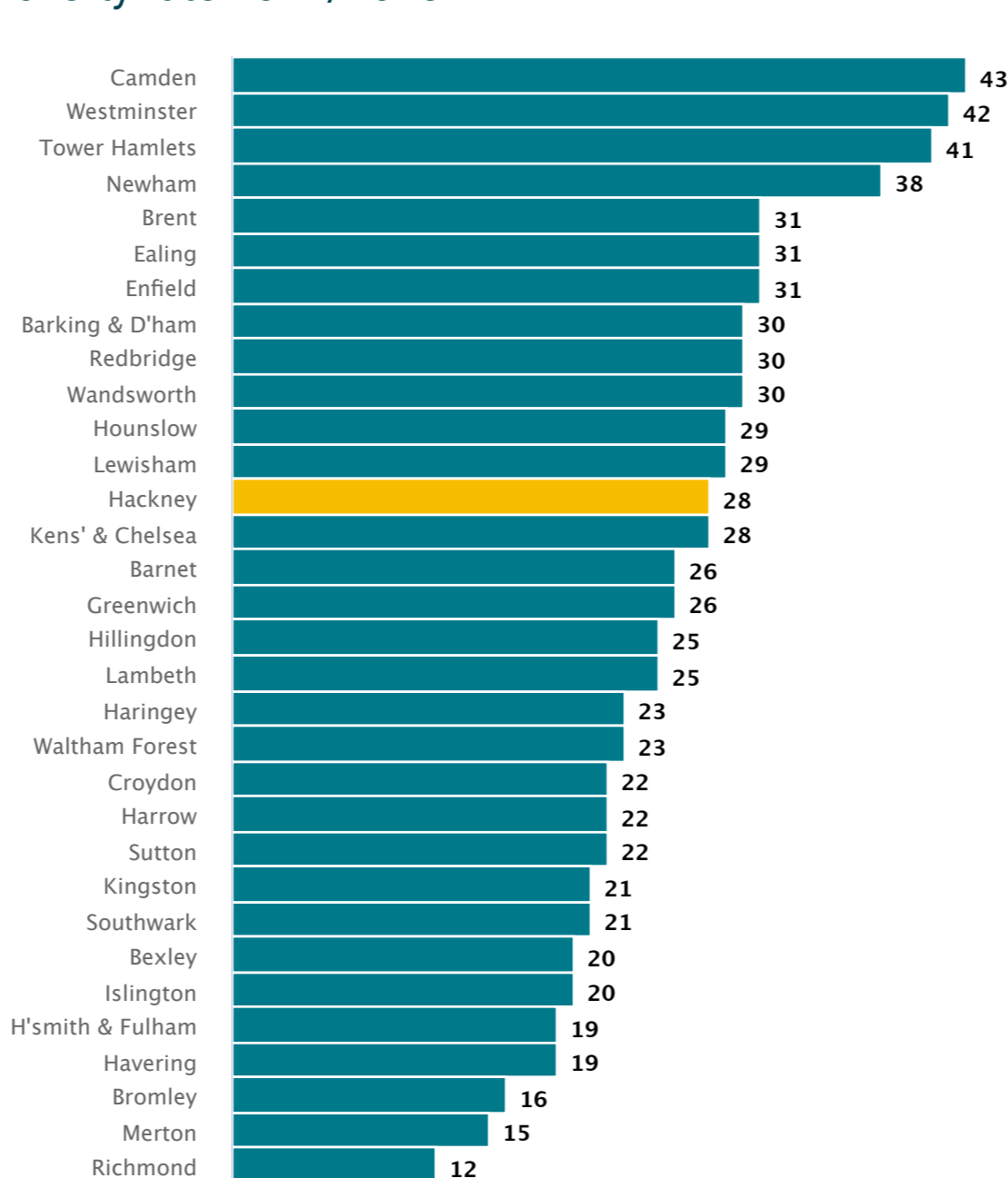
- In 2022/23, 28% of people in the borough lived in households with an income of less than 60% the UK median after housing costs have been subtracted. This was around the same as the average London Borough.
- 43% of children in the borough lived in households with an income of less than 60% the UK median after housing costs have been subtracted in 2022/23. This was worse than the average London Borough.
- In Hackney, 16.7% of residents were estimated to be earning below the Living Wage in 2023. This was around the same as the average London Borough.
- Unemployment change in 2024 Q1 at -1.1 percentage points from 3 years ago was better than the average London Borough.
- The unemployment rate for 2024 Q1 was 4.1% in Hackney, better than the average London Borough.
- Relative to London overall, for Hackney the average neighbourhood in the borough was 1.8 times as income-deprived than the average in London in 2019.
- Premature death rates per 100,000 in Hackney were worse than the average London Borough at 404 in 2022

Income estimates 2020



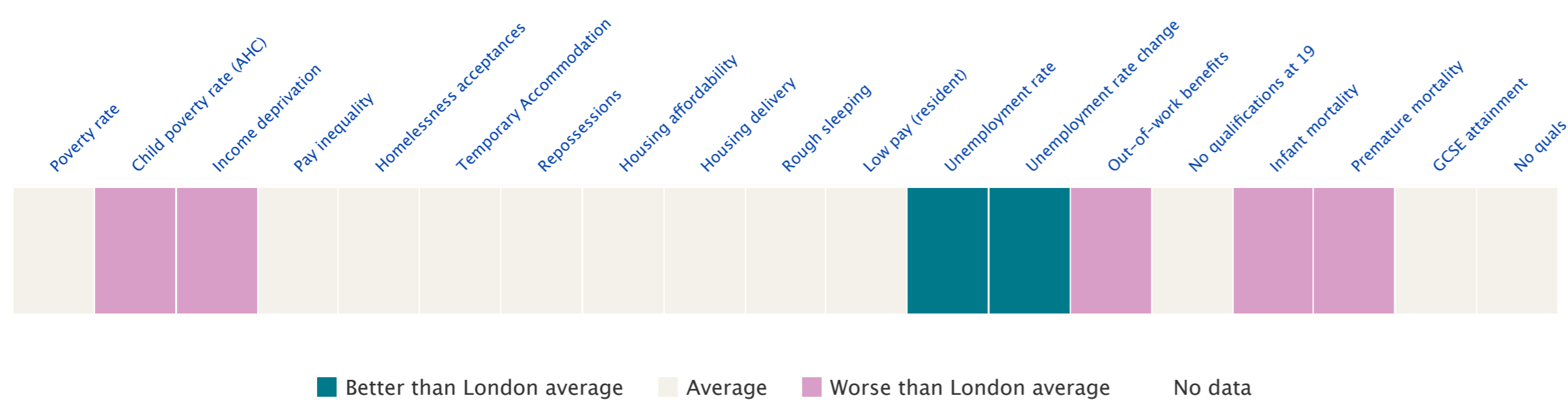

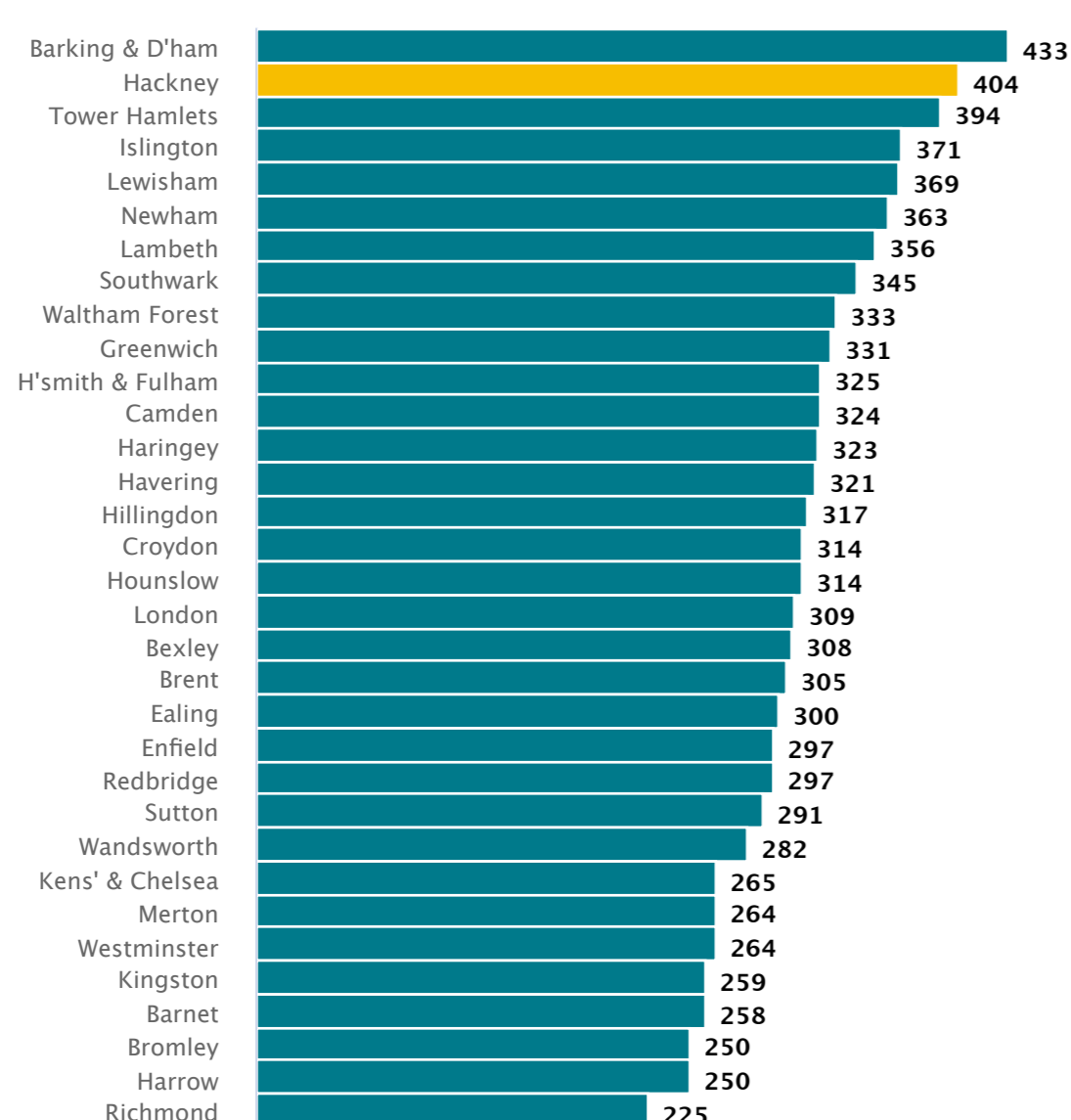
Hackney ratings across key indicators



Looking across all the indicators collected at Borough level for the London Poverty Profile, Hackney did worst for Premature deaths per 100,000 under-75 year olds by London borough, and best for Unemployment rate 3 year change.

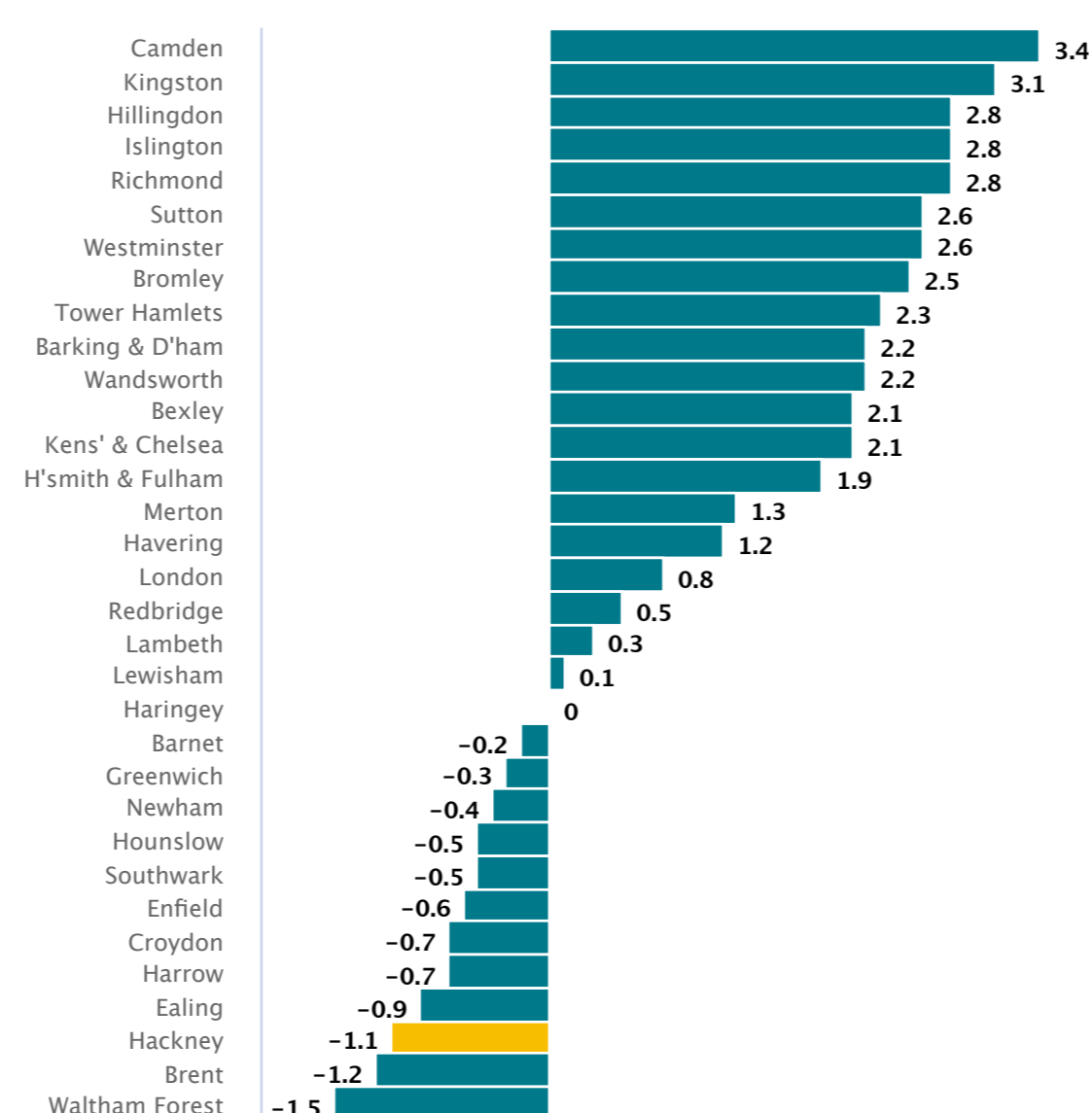
Deaths of <75 year olds per 100,000 2022
